- Keith Kupferschmid of SIIA's Anti-Piracy Staff provided a detailed overview of his group's focus and efforts. The SIIA's Anti-Piracy Staff works to mitigate the misuse and unauthorized use of software and content of SIIA members. The group has two targeted areas --- a Corporate Anti-Piracy program as well as an Internet Piracy program (where significant attention is paid to websites like eBay and Napster and the transfer of copyrighted material. Keith discussed the group's efforts related to educating their target audiences. A number of products and methods are made available to the public ranging from posters and videos to more substantive certification courses on content management geared toward compliance officers, corporate librarians, IT managers, etc.
- FISD Staff provided an overview of the new APWG Online Community highlighting the opportunities provided via this site and encouraged its use.
- Mark Frankish and Bernhard Gardeman of Reuters gave the Working Group a WebEx presentation of Reuters' Open DACS product.
