### MAY 24

Again this week cybersecurity is the headline IT issue in the Administration's proposed legislation. It's not a typo that it was scheduled for this Wednesday alone. That's in addition to the hearing yesterday. At that hearing, Committee Chair Joe Barton and member Susan Collins (R-ME) voiced strong support for the bill that it closely tracks their draft legislation.

However, they did note a couple key differences that will be moved forward. Specifically, Sens. Lieberman and Collins support liability protection in the event of a cyber attack, the lack of clear language limiting the President's special authority in an emergency. Of course, there are still plenty of other significant issues which is the definition of "critical infrastructure." Majority Leader Schumer will lead the effort to finalize draft cyber legislation in the Senate once the draft becomes available.

On the IP front, the Judiciary Committee markup of the PROTECT IP Act slated for last week was pushed back to this Thursday. In the meantime, Tuesday to Judiciary Committee leaders voicing support for the bill to strengthen the U.S. government's ability to combat software piracy, especially against operations taking place on foreign web services and innovation in online technologies and services.

Still on the radar screen, Sen. Amy Klobuchar (D-MN) could introduce cloud computing legislation with Sen. Orrin Hatch (R-UT) tuned on this front.
