The patent reform train continued moving down the tracks with the America Invents Act (H.R. 1249) by a vote of 304-117. There were several respects from the Senate version that passed several deals with fee diversion, tax strategy patents, prior user rights issues. Despite the differences and a heavy debate about the discussions are ongoing about a strategy to reconcile the Senate passage of the House bill. Regardless, the strong legislation in both chambers make for good odds on enactment.

On the cybersecurity front, last week House Speaker John Boehner created a 12-member Republican task force to assess the state of cybersecurity in the Administration's proposal, and provide recommendations. Rep. Lou Gohmert (R-TX), who was appointed to lead on this issue earlier this month, is joined by Reps. Aderholt (R-AL), Chaffetz (R-UT), Coffman (R-CO), Latta (R-OH), Lungren (R-CA), McCaul (R-TX), Mica (R-FL), and Terry (R-NE).

Also last week, the Supreme Court decided a case that loomed large for publishers. In the case [Sorrell vs. IMS Health](#) the Court ruled on a decision that a Vermont law prohibiting the use of physician prescribing data for purposes. While Justice Kennedy's majority opinion expressed "serious and unresolved" issues with respect to personal privacy, the Court did not unfairly imposed a first Amendment burden "based on the commercial identity" of pharmaceutical manufacturing companies. In so doing, the Court held that commercial speech is equally entitled to the protections of the first Amendment.
